## **Community Power Committee Meeting**

## Minutes:

- 1. Discussion of committee roles
  - 1. Election of Chair or Acting Chair (still open)
  - 2. John Harrington to post agendas, meeting minutes, and any notices. John will host the Zoom meeting and include on the meeting agendas.
  - 3. Megan Ulin to take notes for minutes.
- 2. Discussion of milestones.
  - 1. Main milestone is town meeting 2024. To launch program, will need customer data, which requires local and PUC approval. Application to PUC has ~60-day turnaround. After town meeting approval, ~60 days are need to launch program, assuming PUC approval is done first. Potential for June 1<sup>st</sup> launch.
  - 2. Standard Power to provide schedule to committee with main milestones.
  - 3. Anticipate ~8-10 meetings needed to cover main elements of process.
  - 4. Standard Power recommends twice a month schedule for meetings. Quorum (50% + 1) is needed to meet. 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays of the month suggested and agreed upon by the committee.
  - 5. Emily Manns to provide next agenda, with upcoming anticipated schedule and meeting topics. Overview of Community Power, and Survey to be topic of next meeting.
- 3. Discussion of how solar customers are impacted by community power
  - 1. Wes Golomb asked the question of how solar customers on net metering are handled under the program.
  - 2. Standard Power expects that people with solar on the first/original net metering tariff will benefit from the program if they produce less than they consume. Those that produce more than they consume are also fine.
  - 3. For people on the second/alternative tariff they will have to do the math to determine benefit, which Standard Power can assist with.
